Instructions for Use of Import Permits

1. Print Import Permit and Statement of Health letter.
2. Read each of the 3 statements on the "Statement of Health" letter.
3. If all 3 statements are true, please print your name, telephone number, sign and date the letter. If any one of these statements are not true the Veterinary Genetics Laboratory cannot accept the samples.
4. Fold the Import Permit and Statement of Health letter and place them in an envelope.
5. Write the words "IMPORT PERMIT" on the outside of the envelope.
6. Tape the envelope to the outside of your package with the words "IMPORT PERMIT" facing out.

THIS PERMIT IS ISSUED UNDER AUTHORITY CONTAINED IN 9 CFR CHAPTER 1, PARTS 94, 95 AND 122. THE AUTHORIZED MATERIALS OR THEIR DERIVATIVES SHALL BE USED ONLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RESTRICTIONS AND PRECAUTIONS SPECIFIED BELOW (ALTERATIONS OF RESTRICTIONS CAN BE MADE ONLY WHEN AUTHORIZED BY USDA, APHIS, VS).

- **Adequate safety precautions shall be maintained during shipment and handling to prevent dissemination of disease.**

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in the permit. The Permittee is the legal importer/recipient [as applicable] of regulated article(s) and is responsible for complying with the permit conditions. The Permittee must be at least 18 years of age and have and maintain an address in the United States that is specified on the permit; or if another legal entity, maintain an address or business office in the United States with a designated individual for service of process; and serve as the contact for the purpose of communications associated with the import, transit, or transport of the regulated article(s). **Note: Import/Permit requirements are subject to change at any time during the duration of this permit.

- ***Each shipment shall be accompanied by an ORIGINAL signed document from the producer/manufacturer: 1) confirming that the exported materials are samples of tissue, blood, serum, semen, purified DNA, dental, bone, fecal, urine, and/or hair derived from bovine, cervid, camelid (llama/alpaca), caprine, and/or ovine species not known to be or suspected of having been exposed to or infected with any specific animal pathogen; 2) confirming that the exported materials were derived from animals that originated in countries considered by USDA APHIS to be free of foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) [see FMD free region list below; signed document must state specific countries of bovine species origin]; 3) confirming that prior to export to the United States, the exported materials were subjected to a heat treatment at a minimum of 72°C for at least 30 minutes; and 4) confirming that the exported materials were not exposed to any other animal origin material. [This certification must CLEARLY correspond to the shipment by means of an invoice number or shipping marks or lot number or other identification method. An English translation must be provided.]

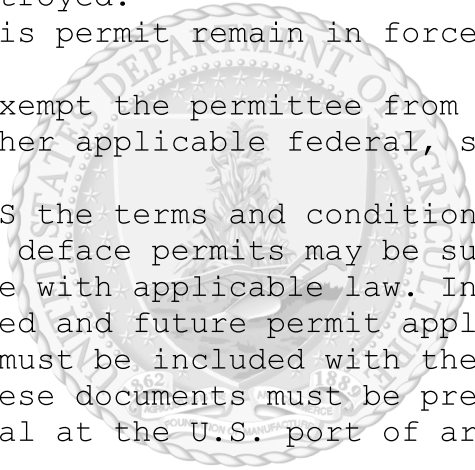

- IMPORTED MATERIALS, THEIR DERIVATIVES, AND/OR ANYTHING PRODUCED USING THE IMPORTED MATERIALS OR THEIR DERIVATIVES SHALL NOT BE USED FOR REPRODUCTION AT ANY TIME.
- IMPORTED MATERIALS, THEIR DERIVATIVES, AND/OR ANYTHING PRODUCED USING THE IMPORTED MATERIALS OR THEIR DERIVATIVES MAY NOT BE USED FOR COMMERCIAL PRODUCTION OR DISTRIBUTION AT ANY TIME.
- This permit does NOT authorize the import of samples from animals suspected of infection with any foreign animal disease agent (including, but not limited to, foot and mouth disease, Rift Valley fever, lumpy skin disease, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, bovine spongiform encephalopathy) or work with these disease agents or diagnostic samples.
- This permit DOES NOT authorize direct or indirect exposure of or inoculation into domestic or laboratory livestock (including but not limited to: birds/poultry/eggs, cattle, sheep, goats, swine, and/or horses). Work with materials and/or their derivatives shall be limited to *in vitro* uses only.
- Packaging, containers, and all equipment in contact with these materials shall be sterilized or considered a biohazard and be disposed of accordingly.
- THIS PERMIT IS VALID ONLY FOR WORK CONDUCTED OR DIRECTED BY YOU OR YOUR DESIGNEE IN YOUR PRESENT U.S. FACILITY OR APPROPRIATELY INSPECTED LABORATORY. THE AUTHORIZED IMPORTED MATERIAL(S) MUST BE SHIPPED/CONSIGNEE DIRECTLY TO THE ADDRESS OF THE PERMITTEE OR TO THE ADDRESS OF THE ADDITIONAL PERMITTEE(S) AS IDENTIFIED ON THIS PERMIT. (MATERIALS AND/OR THEIR DERIVATIVES SHALL NOT BE MOVED TO ANOTHER U.S. LOCATION, OR DISTRIBUTED WITHIN THE U.S., WITHOUT USDA, APHIS VETERINARY SERVICES AUTHORIZATION.)
- Records of amounts received, use, and final disposition must be maintained by the University of California, Davis for a minimum of 5 years and must be made available to USDA during routine inspection or upon request.
- Importing facility is subject to routine inspection by USDA, APHIS personnel during normal business hours to ensure compliance with permit restrictions.
- Imported material may be subject to regulations enforced by the United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Importer must contact the Division of Import Operations and Policy at Area Code (301) 796-0356.
- Importer/permittee is responsible for obtaining any required authorization (letter or permit) from the Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (DHHS, CDC). Importer to contact: (404) 718-2077.

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- On completion of your work, all permitted materials and all derivatives therefrom shall be destroyed.
- The restrictions on this permit remain in force as long as the material is in the United States.
- This permit does not exempt the permittee from responsibility for compliance with any other applicable federal, state, or local laws and regulations.
- Any person who VIOLATES the terms and conditions of permits, and/or who forge, counterfeit, or deface permits may be subject to criminal and civil penalties in accordance with applicable law. In addition, all current permits may be cancelled and future permit applications denied.
- A copy of this permit must be included with the shipping documents. For imported materials, these documents must be presented to CBP Agricultural Specialists upon arrival at the U.S. port of arrival.
